

October 22 - The Developing South China Sea Crisis - Dr. James Boutilier

What pressures will China's aggressive territorial actions in the South China Sea exert on US-China relations?

James Boutilier, Special Advisor to Commander of Maritime Forces Pacific Headquarters, Canada, on matters of defense and foreign policy in the Asia-Pacific region, will share his perspective at our 2018 season kickoff meeting.



Dr. Boutilier earned a BA in history from Dalhousie University, an MA in history from McMaster University, and a PhD in history from the University of London. He has held posts at various universities, including the University of the South Pacific in Suva, Fiji, the Royal Roads Military College in Victoria, British Columbia and the University of Victoria.

He lectures nationally and internationally on political, economic and global security developments, and has published extensively on maritime and security concerns.

Our November Program Sheds Light on Dark Net

November 12 - The Dark Perils of Our Virtual World - Ron Nehring



Explore the Deep Internet, the anonymous web, where hackers and spies thrive and everything is for sale.

Speaker Ron Nehring is a strategist and communications expert who served as National

Spokesman in the 2016 Presidential campaign of Senator Ted Cruz.

He has served as an expert lecturer and trainer in the areas of governance and communications for government officials and candidates in regions including Bosnia, Serbia, Morocco, Egypt, Chile, Spain, Italy, Canada, Honduras, Germany, Belgium, the United Kingdom, and Iraq. He has served as an international election observer in Kenya and Honduras.

Previously, Nehring was elected the Republican nominee for Lt. Governor of California, in 2014.Nehring also served as chairman of the California Republican Party. He inherited an organization millions of dollars in debt and ensured that

upon leaving office, all bills were paid, there was no debt, and a substantial cash reserve existed in the bank. Financial controls were improved and a professional staff put in place.

Governor Schwarzenegger appointed him to the California Board of Forestry and Fire Protection in 2005 in the aftermath of the Cedar Fire, the largest and most destructive wildfire in American history. Nehring participated in the development of new regulations to improve management of lands and property to reduce wildfire threats to families and communities.

Ron graduated from the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

"The Museum and WACD share a common mission of educating young people, a vital task in our valley. I am fortunate to be able to serve institutions that inform youth about the past and the present, so that they can walk confidently into the future and take up the reins of leadership."
