Explore the Deep Internet, the anonymous web, where hackers and spies thrive and everything is for sale.

Speaker Ron Nehring is a strategist and communications expert who served as National Spokesman in the 2016

Presidential campaign of Senator Ted Cruz.

He has served as an expert lecturer and trainer in the areas of governance and communications for government officials and candidates in regions including Bosnia, Serbia, Morocco, Egypt, Chile, Spain, Italy, Canada, Honduras, Germany, Belgium, the United Kingdom, and Iraq. He has served as an international election observer in Kenya and Honduras.

Previously, Nehring was elected the Republican nominee for Lt. Governor of California, in 2014.Nehring also served as chairman of the California Republican Party. He inherited an organization millions of dollars in debt and ensured that upon leaving office, all bills were paid, there was no debt, and a substantial cash reserve existed in the bank. Financial controls were improved and a professional staff put in place.

Governor Schwarzenegger appointed him to the California Board of Forestry and Fire Protection in 2005 in the aftermath of the Cedar Fire, the largest and most destructive wildfire in American history. Nehring participated in the development of new regulations to improve management of lands and property to reduce wildfire threats to families and communities.

Ron graduated from the State University of New York at Stony Brook.




Weinberger is the National Security Editor at *The Intercept*, and a global fellow at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars. She was a Radcliffe Institute Fellow at Harvard in 2015-2016, and a Knight Science Journalism Fellow at MIT in 2008-2009. She has also been an International Reporting Project Fellow

at Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies, an Alicia Patterson Fellow, a Carnegie Fellow at Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism, a Nation Institute Investigative Fellow, and a Carnegie Newhouse Legal Reporting Fellow. She received her B.A. from Johns Hopkins University, and holds an M.A. from the University of Pittsburgh's Graduate School of Public and International Affairs and an M.A. in Russian and East European Studies from Yale University. Her writing has appeared in *Nature, Discover, BBC.com, Slate, Wired, the Washington Post, Foreign Policy,* and the *Financial Times,* among other publications.

February 25 - DEBRIEFING THE PRESIDENT - John Nixon

John Nixon is a former CIA operative and author of "<u>Debriefing the President: The Interrogation of Saddam Hussein.</u>"

Brought to prominence as the CIA agent who interrogated Saddam Hussein and was responsible for briefing President George W Bush and senior administration officials on the inside affairs in Iraq, Nixon will discuss the complex official and emotional relationships between US presidents and intelligence agencies that define America's national security policies.



Nixon was a senior leadership analyst with the CIA from 1998 to 2011. He did

several tours in Iraq and was recognized by a number of federal agencies for his contribution to the war effort. During his time with the CIA, Nixon briefed the most senior levels of the US government. He also taught leadership analysis to the new generation of analysts at the Sherman Kent School, the CIA's in-house analytic training center.

Since leaving the Agency in 2011, Nixon has worked as an international risk consultant in Abu Dhabi, UAE.



During a tour of the Newseum, a museum opened in 2008,


whose mission is to promote the five freedoms of the first amendment, they won "free press" t-shirts by answering all the current events questions correctly.

Speros enjoyed a thirty-year career in education, teaching English and history in public and private schools in California and Australia. Speros graduated from Northwestern University where she was a member of the Alpha Chi Omega sorority. She has been very active with the Coachella Valley Alumnae Panhellenic organization where she has served as corresponding secretary of the executive board, head of special projects and scholarship co-chair. She also serves as scholarship chair for the Northwestern Club of Coachella Valley and has served on other NU boards, including alumni admissions. She earned her Master's Degree from United States International University (USIA), now Alliant International University.

Speros married her high school sweetheart, and she and Bill moved from the Midwest to Irvine CA in 1969. In 1984, they bought their first home in the Coachella Valley so they could enjoy weekends in the desert. While in Orange County, Speros taught at University High School and coached girls' tennis. She also volunteered with the Irvine Historical Museum, Friends for the Library and various committees of St. Marks Presbyterian Church. She served as President of Orange County Women's Action for New Directions, focusing on educational, environmental and health care issues.

Throughout her life, Speros has pursued her passionate interests in educating students, life-long learning and policies supporting world peace. She has traveled to Israel and the West Bank under the auspices of the Holy Land

Trust, staying with a Palestinian Christian family. She also worked in Nicaragua with Witness For Peace.

In 2005, Speros became a full-timer in the Valley. "WACD was meeting at Las Palmas Resort, and the Northwestern Club's members were invited as special guests," she said. "I knew immediately that stimulating speakers could address my interests in international relations. It was also important to meet new people."

"As an educator, I was drawn to WorldQuest and the opportunity to work with high school youth,' Speros said. "Priscilla Porter was my daughter's first grade teacher in Irvine, so the loyalty was immediate. Doris Wilson, Priscilla and Chuck Porter are my heroes."

Speros particularly enjoys being a mentor to students participating in WorldQuest. "With Regina Garrison on the team, WorldQuest is a well-run and exciting organization," she said.
